We will read, analyze, and study short passages together to learn about the main purpose of an informational text. Students will ask and answer questions to identify the main purpose of the text.</p> <p>Monday / Reading: Through a video I will explain to the students that informational text has a main purpose. I will explain what is the main purpose of a text (what the author wants to answer, explain and describe) and how to identify it. I will provide some examples of how to do it and apply it on their own. I will read a short passage and ask them to answer some questions.</p> <p>Assignment: Students will ask and answer questions about the topic/text.
