Literacy SMARTE Priority Goal

60% of students in **kindergarten through 5th grade** will be on target for IRLA reading level by the end of the year in 2025. **4K**: 70% of Converse 4k students will be proficient on the Frog Street syllables and sounds assessment.

Math SMARTE Priority Goal

Kindergarten through 5th grade: 100% of Converse students will receive tier 2 math support and/or enrichment at their level of readiness; 75% of students will complete a minimum of 27 hours by May 30th, 2025. This tiered support and/or enrichment will be monitored and completed through the School District of Beloit approved tier 2 resource, "Imagine Math." **4K:** 75% of Converse 4k students will be able to subitize up to five objects by May 30th, 2025.
