	Challenge: With the reorganization of schools, we have challenges with space, resources, new curriculum, and helping all staff members and students feel supported.

We want to continue to help build resilience (feel safe, connected, and regulated) in our students which will help students be ready for learning which will ultimately affect achievement. Literacy SMARTE Priority Goal

During the 2024-25 school year, students will meet or exceed their growth goals, including moving the number of students that exceed expectations from 31% to 36%. To meet this goal, students in grades 1st through 5th who are below grade level will show 1.5 years of growth or beyond by May 5; students who start the year at or above grade level in 1st through 5th will gain at least 1 year of growth by May 5; 65% of kindergarten students will reach 2G by May 5.

May 5th is selected from the Assessment Calendar as the last IRLA screening window for 2024-25.

Math SMARTE Priority Goal

By the end of the 2024-25 school year, on average K through 2nd grade students will pass 20 lessons or more, and 3rd through 5th grade students will pass 30 lessons or more in Imagine Math. We will use the Imagine Math Benchmark assessment, given multiple times a year, to monitor progress on student math growth. By the end of the school year, students will move from 16% to 30% proficient/meeting and from 1% to 5% advanced/exceeding.

SEB SMARTE Priority Goal

During the 2024-25 school year, we will implement a tiered response to student attendance and also reward students for consistently good attendance in order to improve our building attendance rate from 91% to 95% (in line with district goal) or higher.
