


Is your primary residence in the School District of Beloit?





In which municipality do you live?











Are you an employee of the School District of Beloit?













Operational Funding Planning




Like most other school districts across Wisconsin, Beloit has experienced a decline in student enrollment. We currently serve about 5,500 students, nearly 25% less than 15 years ago. **The fewer students we have, the less money we receive from the state.** At the same time, our costs continue to increase, especially for special education services, transportation, and utilities.

Voters in many Wisconsin districts (65%) have approved an operational referendum to help address these funding challenges. We will need to secure an operational referendum to maintain current class sizes, programs, and student services.

Facility Funding Planning



Maintenance staff do all they can to keep our buildings in good condition. The District replaced some boilers and roof sections from the annual budget in the past few years, which meant we did not have to take on debt. However, we have other issues that need to be addressed:

- Safety and security systems should be upgraded with a main, central entrance to better control and monitor visitor access; keyed doors should be replaced with a more secure keyless entry system; security cameras need to be upgraded.
- Fire alarm panels need to be replaced in most buildings.
- Many major building systems (heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and electrical) across our schools are original to the buildings and need to be updated.
- Much of our plumbing is between 60 and 80 years old and must be replaced.
- Many windows are beyond their service life, are inefficient, and increase utility costs.
- Lights should be replaced with LEDs to save energy costs.
- Exterior doors and walls are in disrepair, leak, and are rusted/cracking.
- Internal furnishings (such as floors, doors, ceilings, and cabinetry) are worn and need to be replaced.


Facility Funding Planning (cont'd)

- > Parking lots and sidewalks are cracked and crumbling and need to be repaired/resurfaced.
- > Some cafeterias and kitchens across the District are too small and need to be expanded.
- Many restrooms are outdated and do not comply with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations.
- Bleachers need to be upgraded to comply with ADA regulations.
- Softball and baseball fields are not on campus, which requires after-school transportation and creates safety/supervision concerns.
- The high school gym was built in 1950 and should be upgraded to support phy ed courses, practices/competitions, and community access.
- The **football stadium** is outdated (including concessions, restrooms, locker rooms, and entrances), and the **track** is cracking.
- ➤ High school and intermediate school **locker rooms** are original to the buildings and do not meet current HVAC codes.

The costs to pay for these projects listed above are too large to be covered in our annual maintenance budget. Therefore, voters would need to approve a capital referendum.

Great = 4

Good = 3

Fair = 2

Poor = 1.



What did we learn?

- There is a great deal of overlap among subgroups (staff, parents/caregivers, and non-parents/non-staff) regarding what's going well and what isn't, advice for a new superintendent, and where to focus planning/resources.
- The District should begin to clarify plans for an operational and capital referendum so that community members understand the answers to three questions:
 - What projects are needed?
 - Why are those projects needed?
 - How much will the projects cost?
