This provides teachers an opportunity to look at individual student needs and how to scaffold their learning.
SEB SMARTe Goal:	By the end of the 2025-26 school year, 100% of classroom teachers will implement monthly SEL instruction aligned to a school wide focus using Character Strong SEL resources and will make at least two positive home

	contacts per week, as measured by teacher logs and school communication records, to strengthen student relationships and support a positive school climate.
SEB Strategies:	Monthly Focus Word Implementation: each month, the school will highlight a focus SEL word (e.g. empathy, respect, perseverance); teachers will reinforce the word through repeated teaching and classroom discussions. The SEL pacing guide will be used as a guide. Teachers will use Quaver/Character Strong resources to deliver at least one targeted SEL lesson each week aligned with the monthly focus. Teachers will document two positive home contacts per week to celebrate student progress, behavior, or effort.
