Goal:



Preparing and inspiring every student to succeed in life and contribute to an everchanging world.

To deliver comprehensive learning that will ensure the academic success, safety, and wellbeing of our students and staff with in-person learning and distance learning.





Cohort A will attend in-person classes on Monday and Tuesday and participate in distance (concurrent) learning on Thursday and Friday.

Cohort B will attend in-person classes on Thursday and Friday and participate in distance (concurrent) learning on Monday and Tuesday.





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Families may choose to keep their child(ren) in distance learning for the remainder of Term 4.

Families may choose to have one or more of their children in a cohort or one or more in distance learning.

This is a family choice.



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Busing:

- All students must complete a Student COVID-19 Screener before entering the bus.
- All students and bus drivers will be required to wear a mask.
- Bus capacity is 24 and students will be assigned a seat.
- Buses are cleaned between routes.

Self-Transport: We encourage Self-Transport

- Parents/Guardians that drop-off and pick-up students will not be allowed to enter the school building.
- Students will have a designated door to enter.
- Staff will escort students to their classroom.





Prior to Arriving at School:

- All students must complete Student COVID-19 Screener.
- All families must view our COVID-19 videos.

At School:

- All staff and students will be required to wear masks, except at meal time and naptime.
- Students will be assigned an entrance door and will be escorted into the building by staff.
- Student IDs will be scanned upon entering designated door.



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Classrooms:

- Masks will be required at all times.
- Social distancing protocols will be followed.
- Three-sided plexiglass at tables.
- Hand sanitizer and approved hand wipes in all classrooms.

Hallways, Common Areas, Restrooms:

- Student movement will be limited.
- Common areas will be cleaned during the day and evening.
- Restroom procedures and protocols are established and set at the school level.

Food Service:

Breakfast:

- Safety protocols and procedures are in place for each school.
- Social distancing and plexiglass for cafeteria dining.

Lunch:

- Safety protocols and procedures are in place for each school.
- Social distancing and plexiglass for cafeteria dining.

Grab and Go Meal Service:

7-day food pack available for pick-up and delivery every Wednesday.







A Seven-Step detailed protocol for cleaning is outlined and defined for every school, classroom, bathroom, kitchen, cafeteria, gymnasium, office, breakroom, and shared spaces.

- All products rated effective against COVID-19.
- Hand Sanitizers, Soap, Towels, Toilet Paper are replenished daily.
- Custodial staff are required to wear gloves and masks at all time.





- Masks will be required at all times for staff, students, and all others in our buildings (except for meal time and naptime).
- PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) distributed to all buildings.
- COVID-19 Screeners: Everyone is required to complete a Daily Screener prior to entering a building.
- Screeners can be accessed via phone, computer, our SDB App, QR Code, Safe to Learn Website, and paper option at each school.


