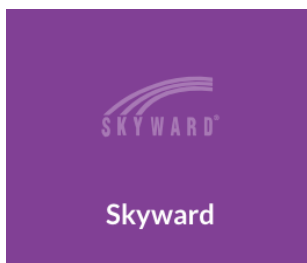

REGISTRATION

SKYWARD FAMILY ACCESS

Students and families can register for Summer School using Skyward Family Access. Families can log-in to [Skyward Family Access](#) by accessing the homepage of any website.



To Register in Skyward:

1. Login to Skyward Family Access
2. Click on, “Summer School Registration”
3. Select your child’s name (this process will need to be completed for each child separately)
4. Follow the steps that take you through the registration. You will need to update family information and select the date and periods/paths for participation

You must have a Skyward account in order to register for Summer School online. Register your student at the grade level they will enter during the fall of the 2021-2022 school year. Login and password account information is available by contacting your student’s current school.

DAILY “A” Path WITH BREAKFAST (Period 1)

7:45 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. | Summer Learning Academic Camp

The “A” Path focuses on academics in literacy and math. Students will engage in standards aligned learning that is both fun and academically focused. In addition, students per recommendation in grades 1-2, will participate in the “I am a reader” opportunity bridge as a part of this session. Students can choose to participate in both the “A” and “WE” Paths.

DAILY “WE” Path WITH LUNCH (Period 2)

10:30 a.m. - 12:15 p.m. | Summer Learning Wellness & Enrichment

The “WE” Path focuses on wellness and enrichment. Students will engage in opportunities to explore hands-on, project-based learning, with embedded arts educational experiences along with activities that promote physical movement and games. Students can choose to participate in both the “A” and “WE” Paths.

PERIODS:

Period 1 with breakfast: 8:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.

Period 2 with lunch: 10:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

Students will participate in “A” Path and “WE” Path opportunities during both periods. The “A” Path courses are focused on academics in literacy and math, and “WE” path courses focus on wellness & enrichment. The “WE” path courses will range from physical activities to areas of interest. Students/Families will receive additional information to schedule courses after registration takes place. There are enough choices for students to participate in both periods 1 & 2. They may also choose to come for one period (either period 1 or 2).

HIGH SCHOOL

DATES: Beginning the week of June 14 - August 6th. Courses will run in either 4-week or 8-week sessions. Students can sign up for courses that run at both times.

SCHOOL SITES: Beloit Memorial High School

REGISTRATION: Students can register for Summer School starting the week of April 26th. Students will enroll in courses with follow-up communication. Access the High School Summer Learning [Course Catalog](#) to view course offerings.

Courses that are available will have blended learning (virtual, in-person, hybrid) opportunities that vary depending on the course. There is an opportunity to focus on Algebra and English for incoming Freshman identified for additional support and bridges. A summer 2021 graduation ceremony will be offered as an opportunity bridge to Seniors that complete all graduation requirements identified during the 2020-21 school year.



EXPECTATIONS

ATTENDANCE: Attendance will be taken daily. For the best possible experience for our students, we ask for consistency in their attendance. We do understand that some level of flexibility is necessary during the summer. Students participating in credit recovery courses will need to have consistent attendance to meet credit/graduation requirements.

DISCIPLINE: During Summer School, all school rules apply as outlined in the [Family Handbook](#). Students are subject to disciplinary action and removal from our Summer School program for inappropriate behavior.

GRADING: Certain sessions will receive a report to inform of progress and/or credits earned.

PROGRAMMING: The intention of our 4K-8 programming is to provide opportunities for students to grow in their academics and participate in enrichment activities. Students in High School should concentrate on credit recovery and support in academics.

REGISTRATION: Registration is a one step process for students in grades 4K-3rd through our Skyward System. Students in grades 4th-12th will engage in a two-step registration process. They will first register through Skyward and then will be contacted to begin the scheduling process. Please contact our Central Enrollment Office for support in registering.

SAFETY PROTOCOLS: Our Summer School building will follow district protocols aimed at mitigating the spread of COVID-19 (handwashing, wearing masks, physical distancing, cleaning, and health & wellness checks). The protocols will continue to be modified and adapted to be in alignment to the most current CDC and Rock County Health Dept. guidelines.

EVEN START FAMILY LITERACY

In Partnership with Blackhawk Technical College

Even Start Family Literacy is a collaboration between the School District of Beloit and Blackhawk Technical College. Parents/guardians enrolled through Blackhawk Technical College and participating in adult education classroom learning English, children (infants to incoming 4K) are in a separate, on-site early-learning environment that fosters development of early literacy skills.

Early literacy skills that are learned during parent time can be shared during interactive literacy activities. These activities take place between parents/guardians and children during program hours.
