### General Information

#### **How will I learn about the high school?**

Because the high school can seem big with many new faces, the Link Crew program has been instituted to help freshmen feel more comfortable. Each freshmen student will be assigned to a Link Leader, who is a junior or a senior at BMHS. Link Leaders will help orient the freshmen at the start of the school year and will stay in continued contact with the freshmen throughout the year. All Freshmen are part of the Freshmen Academy consisting of an Assistant Principal and School Counselor to help you.



### Daily Schedule

For all 10-12 graders, BMHS operates on a modified 5-block schedule, which consists of 4 terms per year with four 85 minute classes, a 40 minute lunch period, one 40 minute academic class or intervention period.

#### **Who will I be in classes with?**

In most cases your required classes will be with classmates of the same grade. However, most elective classes are mixed grades.

#### **What class choices am I able to take?**

Every winter students choose from a wide variety of courses including Orchestra, Band, Choir, Theatre, Visual Arts, Ceramics, Sculpture and Painting. BMHS offers Foreign Language classes in Spanish, and French. JROTC is available to all students as an elective. Other courses are offered in the areas of Auto Servicing, Business and Marketing Co-op, Child Care Services, Advanced Technology, Graphic Design and Computerized Drafting. Seniors also have the opportunity to take classes during the school day at Blackhawk Technical College, UW-Rock County and/or Beloit College. The Porter Scholars program at Beloit College offers selected seniors a chance to take one class per semester free of charge.

#### **What Advance Placement courses are offered?**

BMHS offers Advanced Placement courses in English Lang & Comp, English Lit & Comp, US Government, US History, World History Psychology, European History, Human Geography, Physics 1 & 2, Biology, Environmental Science, Chemistry, AB & BC Calculus, Statistics, Computer Science A, Studio Art, Art History, Music Theory, Spanish, and French.

**Do I have to wear an ID?**

ID's are to be carried on your person at all times. Your ID is used to check out library books and to get into special school events. If you lose your ID, you must order a new ID. The cost for replacement ID is \$5.00.

**Should I get involved in extra-curricular activities and sports?**

Yes! The activities you can choose from are numerous! Being involved in extra-curricular activities and sports not only gives you a chance to meet other BMHS students who share your interests, but can be helpful when applying for jobs, colleges, and scholarships. You may talk with your School Counselor about all sports and activities that are available.

**What sports are offered?**

You may choose from 22 Varsity sports, including Football, Boys & Girls Soccer, Boys & Girls Cross-country, Boys & Girls Volleyball, Boys & Girls Golf, Boys & Girls Swim, Boys & Girls Tennis, Boys & Girls Basketball, Wrestling, Boys & Girls Hockey, Boys Baseball, Girls Softball, Boys & Girls Track and Spirit Squad

**Can I receive balloons/flowers at school?**

Students are not to have balloons or flower bouquets in the classroom to avoid distraction from the learning environment. If such items are delivered, they will remain in the office for student to pick up at dismissal.

**What student club/organizations are available at BMHS?**

BMHS has many opportunities for students to get involved with clubs, organizations and classes to excel outside the classroom. These include: Band, Orchestra, Choir, Jazz Band, Student Senate, Leos, Key Club, Environmental Club, Theatre, Minority Excellence Organization, Latino Club, National Honor Society, Increscent Newspaper, Link Crew, DECA, FBLA, JROTC Drill & Rifle Teams, French Club, International Club and many more.

**BMHS SPECIAL EVENTS PRIVILEGE-BASED  
ADMISSION PRACTICES & EXPECTATIONS**

Includes, but not limited to: Homecoming, Winter Formal, Prom & Other School Events:

- A signed contract for dances must be approved prior to purchasing dance tickets.
- You must present your student ID to gain admission.
- Unexcused absences will count against privilege for participation in dances or activities. See specific event for details
- Student suspensions will count against privilege of participating in dances or activities. See specific event contracts.

**PROM:** In addition to the above requirements, the following also apply to Prom:

- All tickets are numbered and sold to specific individuals with a signed contract.
- **NO REFUNDS** will be given for any reason including students who do not show up for any reason (including suspension from school) or are not allowed to enter due to Code of Conduct infractions such as, but not limited to, improper behavior, dress code violation, or use/possession of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs.

**What if my parent/guardian needs to get a message to me?**

Students will not be pulled from class to take a phone call. A message will be taken and given to the student.

**Can I use electronic devices in school?****Board Policy #443.5**

Cell Phones **MUST** be both silenced and **PUT AWAY** during instructional time. The use of communication features on cellular devices during instructional time is prohibited. Each teacher has the right to follow the use of mobile devices (e.g. cell phones, laptops, ipods and personal data assistants) during class **for instructional purposes**. The non-disruptive use of cell phone texting and iPod use in the hallway before/after school, during passing periods and lunch periods is permissible. In an emergency situation, teachers can give a student permission to make a call from a cell phone. The use of camera phones is strictly forbidden by law in private areas, such as, locker rooms, washrooms, dressing areas. Such use may also be in violation of the criminal code. A device brought to school is the sole responsibility of the student. BMHS is not responsible for the loss, theft, or misplacement of any electronic device.

**Knight Spot Privileges**

(Freshmen after Term 1 with a 3.75 GPA or above)

Students have the opportunity to use the Knight Spot. The student lounge is available at various supervised times during the school day. The student lounge will be accessible by using a student issued Key Card which can be electronically turned on or off. The criteria for having the opportunity to access the student lounge is as follows:

- Students must have a **3.00** current term GPA
- Students can have no more than 5 unexcused absences during the semester
- Student can have no school suspensions
- Students can have no #200 or #300 code of conduct violations and no more than one #100 level school code violations in a term

A student can be cleared each term to earn student lounge privileges. However, any of the above requirements will cancel their access to the student lounge anytime throughout the school year.

### **Who can I talk with if I have problems?**

Your teachers are the best choice to discuss class concerns. There are also 4 counselors and 5 administrators. The school psychologist can provide evaluation and consultation with youth, parents, teachers, administrators and community. The social worker assists families as liaison between home, school, and community. Link Crew Leaders are also great people to talk to when you have questions.

### **If I drive to school, can I park in the parking lot?**

Only those students who have applied for, qualify, and receive a parking permit are eligible to park in the student lot. All cars in the lot must have a parking permit. Cars parked in the lot without a permit are ticketed by the City of Beloit.

### **What if my parent/guardian needs to get a message to me?**

Students will not be pulled from class to take a phone call. A message will be taken and given to the student.



### **Appointments**

Due to the number of students, appointments are needed if you would like to see your assistant principal or guidance counselor. Appointments guarantee your time slot!



### **Attendance**

When classes are in session, **ALL** students are expected to be in their assigned classroom. Students are not to leave the room unless given a pass from the teacher.

### **What do I do if I am absent from school?**

All Absences require a written verification from the parent or legal guardian. The note should state the date(s) of absence, the reason, a parent/guardian signature and a phone number. Before school, between classes and at lunch excuses should be taken to Academic Affairs. You have 2 days after your absence to turn in your excuse, otherwise it stays unexcused.

### **What do I do if I am absent for several days?**

Classroom work can be requested through the Counseling Office at 361-3029. When you return please talk with your teachers about missed work. You will be responsible to make up any work missed.

### **Verified excuses, unexcused and excused absences, what is the difference?**

By school board policy a parent can excuse their student ten (10) times per school year. All absences after 10 will be considered unexcused. (431 RULE 1 dc). Parent/guardians please use excused absences sparingly as you have only 10 per year. Verified excuses are signed by the doctor, dentists, legal firm, etc. and returned to school. There is no limit on verified excuses. It should be noted though the more you miss the more difficult it is to keep up and learn.

### **What are the consequences of not attending class?**

The rule is – don't skip class. With our Block Schedule, every class period missed means you have missed 2 classes which puts you further behind. Part of or all five (5) different days unexcused can result in loss of credit, and if continued could result in truancy fines up to \$1,000 per school year.

### **What if I need to leave school early for an appointment?**

Verification in writing or by phone is required by your parent/guardian to be excused for doctor/dental, etc. appointments. Students will only be released to parents/guardians or

others who have been designated in writing by the parent or legal guardian. Remember to get the appointment verified (signed by the receptionist, nurse, doctor, etc.) and return it to Academic Affairs.

### **What if I am late to class?**

Tardiness will be defined as any student who arrives within 15 minutes after the starting bell for each class. Anything over 15 minutes will be considered an absence. Students with a pass will receive no penalty. Students without a pass will be assigned a consequence.

### **What if I get sick during school?**

If during the school day you are not feeling well and feel you need to go home, you will need to go to the Nurse's Office to be excused to leave. The nurse will call your parent or guardian or others authorized on your Emergency Card to inform them of your situation. **IF YOU DO NOT HAVE AN EMERGENCY CARD ON FILE, YOU WILL NOT BE EXCUSED TO GO HOME** with anyone except your parent/guardian. An absence excuse will also be required when you return.

### **Can the nurse give me Tylenol, Aspirin, Cough Drops, etc if I am not feeling well?**

No, the nurse cannot give you any over the counter medication. However, there is a form your parent or guardian can complete to be kept on file in the Nurse's office to allow you to take over the counter medication. Your parent/guardian must provide the medication.

### **What can the school nurse do?**

The nurse is limited in treatments she can provide. She can provide general first aid. She does not provide crutches, splints, wheelchairs or air casts.

### **Can I use the elevator?**

No. The elevator is only for students with physical needs or for those with a physician's request. The school nurse will issue you a pass to use the elevator if the need arises.



## **Counseling Office**

All of the BMHS counselors are located in the Counseling Office B107. The counselors are here to help you make good choices in your educational career and to better prepare you for your future. In order to see your counselor, you must make an appointment with them in the Counseling Office. Each Counselor oversees a section of students.

### **How many classes or credits do I need each year to graduate?**

You will need to take at least 8 credits each year. You must pass 26 credits listed below in order to graduate. An appointment with your counselor each year will inform you where you are with your credits.

### **What are the Graduation Requirements?**

A total of 26 Credits are required to graduate from BMHS as follows:

### **How important is my Grade Point Average (GPA)?**

You will find your GPA on your report cards. Your GPA affects your rank in your class and may determine eligibility for advanced classes, participate in sports, extra-curricular activities, and continuing education after high school. GPA is also important if you want to receive academic scholarships your senior year.

### **How can I get help with College and Scholarships?**

BMHS has many colleges, university, and technical school representatives visit throughout

the school year that you may talk with. Your counselor can also assist you with finding the college of your choice and applying for scholarships.

### **How do I get into the National Honor Society?**

Election times during your Junior and Senior year in the Fall is based on your cumulative GPA, your extra-curricular and community involvement. If you want to be part of NHS, start planning and working toward this goal during your freshman year.

### **If I am in danger of failing a class what do I do?**

The minute you need help in a particular class, you should see your teacher or counselor for help. If you do end up failing a class that is a required credit to graduate, you should plan on taking it during summer school or in Knight School.

### **What if after choosing my schedule I want to change a class?**

The rule is "You picked it, you keep it". However, if there is a computer error or you don't meet a prerequisite, you need to see your counselor before the first day of the class. Once you begin the class, it is your responsibility to carry it on to completion.



## **Lockers**

### **Will I have to share a locker?**

The answer to this is NO and we insist that you do not share your locker or combination with anyone. Sharing lockers results in loss and theft of your things. Since sharing a locker is prohibited, if you are caught doing so, discipline for insubordination will result. The locker assigned to you is yours to store your items. Please use magnets and not stickers or tape.

### **Are locks provided?**

The locks are built into the hall lockers at BMHS. You will be issued the same locker for the length of your stay at BMHS. The combination will not change until after you leave. If you are in a PE class or athletic activity, you must purchase a lock from the school only for that locker.



## **Lunch**

### **When do I get lunch and for how long?**

Grade 9 has "closed campus" lunch during Skinny C. You have 40 minutes for lunch until the bell rings for your next class to begin.

Grade 10 has "closed campus" lunch during Skinny A. 11 – 12 grade students have Skinny B lunch (Grade 11 has "closed campus" lunch)

### **What are my choices for lunch?**

BMHS has a regular lunch line along with other specialty food lines, like pizza!. 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders have the option to leave campus for lunch.



## **Transportation**

### **What about school and city bus transportation?**

The district does not offer school bus transportation to the high school. City bus routes are available with discounted student passes.



## **Work Permits**

### **How to I obtain a work permit?**

Work permits are no longer needed for 16 or 17 year olds who are employed in the state of Wisconsin. If you are 14 or 15 years old and need a work permit, applications for Work Permits are available in the Counseling Office B107 at BMHS.
