Upcoming Testing:

Spring always brings with it the season of testing in the world of education.

Last year, Governor Tony Evers *Stay at Home Order* canceled all state and federal testing. As of today, the federal and state governments have not granted districts any flexibility regarding testing. As a result, we are making plans to complete all required tests throughout March, April, and May.

Specific information regarding tests will be shared by building principals. We appreciate and know that standardized testing is typically not the favorite activity of students or teachers. However, the data we receive from these tests is invaluable and informs us as we make curricular and instructional decisions.







Any support you can give to make sure that your child/teen are present on testing days while encouraging them to do their best on the test would be greatly appreciated by everyone in the district.

Preparing for School and Testing Days:

I always encourage students to get a good night's sleep during the school year. It is so important for our students to start the day ready to learn; even more so in Distance Learning. For elementary students, it is recommended that they get at least nine hours of sleep per night and for teen's at least eight hours of sleep.

Along with a good night's sleep, proper nutrition is just as important. Jump starting the day with a good breakfast allows for better concentration and increased energy to sustain classroom participation and lessons. We continue to provide Grab and Go breakfast and lunch meals at all our elementary schools from 11 am to 1:30 pm on Mondays and Thursdays.
