iPad Help and Outreach:

Our iPad sessions at the Beloit Public Library last week were very successful. We were able to help dozens of students and families. We plan to continue these sessions at the Beloit Public Library every Thursday from 11 am to 7 pm to offer students and families some assistance with navigating iPads and apps. School District of Beloit Spanish Interpreters will be available, and no appointment is necessary. Our next date is Thursday, October 8th.

Email Teachers from Skyward:

I have some good news to share. Families can email their student's teachers, counselors and other school contacts when they log into their Skyward Family Access account. Teacher email addresses can be accessed on the Gradebook and Schedule tab, and other email addresses are located under the Student Info tab.

Clicking on a staff member's name will generate a pop-up box containing their email address. Click on the blue email address. A "Send an Email" box will appear pre-filled to send to the selected staff member. Enter the subject of the email on the "Subject" line. Click into the large box on the bottom to compose the message. If you want to receive a copy of the email, put a check mark in the "Send a Copy to Me" box. Let us know what you think of this new feature by sending your feedback to marketing1@sdb.k12.wi.us.

On Mondays, families will receive a breakfast and lunch meal for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday; and on Thursdays, families will receive a breakfast and lunch meal for Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. For families who are unable to pick up meals, we are providing delivery service. Please call (608) 361-3136 to arrange for delivery. Grab and Go Meals are available from 11 am to 1 pm at all our elementary schools and at Beloit Memorial High School at the Elizabeth Reinholz Theater. All children from ages one to 18 are eligible to receive these meals.

Community Partner Update:

This week's partner spotlight is **Latino Service Providers Coalition (LSPC).** The Latino Service Providers Coalition is a nonprofit organization serving in Rock County and the surrounding areas of Beloit.
