Good Afternoon School District of Beloit Families,

At Tuesday's Board of Education meeting, the Board unanimously voted to remain in Distance Learning through Term 3, which ends on March 26. The Board has asked my leadership team and me to provide a comprehensive plan for the start of Term 4, which begins on April 6. I will provide updates to this plan on our [Safe to Learn Website](#) and in my weekly letters.

There is no school on Monday, January 18, in observance and honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. In his own words about education, Dr. King continues to this day to inspire educators and students, "The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically. Intelligence plus character – that is the goal of true education."

Early Childhood Screening:

Do you have a child between the ages of two and five? Do you have concerns about his/her development? We have early childhood screenings available for our families. The upcoming dates for screenings are January 20, February 17, March 17, and April 21. Screenings will take place at Hackett and Todd Elementary Schools. Appointments are required, so please call Wendy Porter at (608) 361-4020 to schedule an appointment.

Typical Childhood Milestones include:

24-36 Months: Child should be able to climb well, turn book pages one at a time, and recognize and identify almost all common objects and pictures.

3-4 Years: Child should be able to kick and throw a ball, use scissors, draw circles and squares, speak in five to six-word sentences, tell stories, and correctly name some colors.

4-5 Years: Child should be able to swing and climb, print some letters, dress independently, recall parts of a story, count to 10 or more objects, wants to please and be with friends, likes to sing, dance, and act.

Grab and Go Meals: Important Update

On Monday, January 18, the School District of Beloit will honor and commemorate Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We will not be serving Grab and Go Meals. We will provide two days of breakfast and lunch meals on Tuesday, January 19. We will back to our regular schedule on Thursday, January 21, providing four days of breakfast and lunch Grab and Go Meals.

As always, Grab and Go Meals are available for pick-up on Mondays and Thursdays from 11 am to 1:30 pm at all six elementary schools. We continue to make deliveries to families who are unable to pick-up meals during this time. If you have not made an arrangement for delivery, you can do so by calling (608) 361-3136. If you have already arranged for delivery, you do not need to call.
