



Please select all schools in which your child(ren)/ teen(s) are attending




Have you received adequate communication/support from your child(ren)'s/teen(s)'s teacher/school since the start of the school year?




Has your child(ren)/teen(s) been able to access Seesaw and or Google Classroom to participate in Distance Learning?

- Teachers are communicating well.

- The communication from Teachers is going well. The amount of work is just right.

- I like that it is more structured than it was in the spring. It is more like being in school, just done at home.
- Ability to go back and watch live lessons.
- The length of class time and the balance of work are good. Excellent access to instructors.
- Live classroom experience is going well.
- Communication with Teacher. Good instruction on how to do things. Things are going smooth.
- My student feels confident with the technology and can navigate the apps.

What (if any) suggestions do you have to improve our Distance Learning model?

- More flexibility and paper work (instead of on iPads) for older students who have issues focusing or getting into live classes due to other responsibilities during the day.
- I am at a loss right now as to how to make this experience better.
- Provide more practice, especially in math.
- Have teachers issue out a "to-do" list each week so students know what they should be getting done each day as it is very easy to fall behind and get lost while doing social distance school.
- While the online platforms for distance learning have been consolidated somewhat compared to the last school year, it can still be difficult to keep track of communication from the school.
- It seems like we are doing a great job so far as a community.
- Just keep improving on what you are doing this year.
- It is hard for the younger kids to sit for a live session longer than 20-30 minutes.
- I think a little more face to face time (zoom) would be useful but for the most part is working ok.
- If there was a way to know your if your child attended the live class that would be helpful to parents who are working. Right now, we are taking them at their word.
- Nothing I can think of right now.
- More homework.
- I am really concerned about the teachers. There is SO much on them right now during Distance Learning. We need to make sure their social emotional wellbeing is taken care of in order for them to teach our children!!
- Longer classes for learning.
- A way for working single parents to keep up with all the work.
- I like the structure this time as opposed to the spring. The workload seems much more reasonable, although my kids need quite a bit of support during this unconventional learning experience.
