### **School District of Beloit**

The School District of Beloit educates and supports approximately 7,000 4K - 12th grade students and their families, and employs over 700 teachers, professional staff, support personnel and administrators.

The district is made up of 14 schools:

- 6 elementary (4K 3) 1 high school (9 12)
- 1 virtual school
- 4 intermediate (4 8) 1 alternative school (6 12) 1 charter school (6 12)

### 2017-2018 District-Wide Highlights


### AVID

AVID, which stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination, is a global nonprofit organization dedicated to closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college and careers. Established more than 35 years ago, there are nearly 6,000 other AVID schools across the country that are dedicated to providing real college opportunities for all students.

Outside the classroom, AVID students visited college campuses like University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Milwaukee School of Engineering. They also attended the Wisconsin College Fair to learn more about the college search process. Students enjoyed an outing to a Milwaukee Bucks Game and volunteered at elementary and intermediate schools for the 100th day of school.
