Dear School District of Beloit Families,

School districts throughout Wisconsin are no longer required to conduct COVID-19 contact tracing as a standard practice.

Rock County has remained at a medium transmission level, and most of the State is at low level transmissions. Therefore, we believe, as well as our local health officials, that it is safe to move away from screening/contact tracing. As of Monday, November 21, we will **no longer be facilitating contact tracing**.

We will continue to work with the Rock County Health Department in the case of an outbreak, and our health offices will communicate current guidelines and recommendations.

We encourage testing for anyone having COVID-like symptoms, and we provide free on-site testing at many of our schools. You can [access locations and times here](#). Those testing positive for COVID-19 will be asked to quarantine.

Anyone experiencing symptoms of illness should stay home from school/work. And again, If you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, please get tested regardless of your vaccination status.
