The Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) Waiver Program is a Home and Community-Based Service (HCBS) Waiver that provides Medicaid funding for children who have substantial limitations in their daily activities and need support to remain in their home or community. Eligible children include those with developmental disabilities, severe emotional disturbances, and physical disabilities. Funding can be used to support a range of different services based on an assessment of the needs of the child and his or her family."

 "VR services are any services described in a plan for employment necessary to assist a consumer in preparing for, securing, retaining or regaining an employment outcome that is consistent with the strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, abilities, capabilities, interests and informed choice of the consumer...Services DVR provides includes: Career Guidance and Counseling, Job Search and Placement Assistance, Information and Referral Services, Supported Employment, Rehabilitation Technology, Vocational Training, Disability and Employment Assessment, Transportation, Occupational Licenses and Tools, Assistance in Small Business Development Plan, Interpreter Services, Rehabilitation Teaching Services, Diagnosis and Treatment, and Post-Employment Services."
