Dear School District of Beloit Families,

As we conclude our school year on Friday, June 5th I want to thank our families, students, teachers, staff, administrators, school board and community partners for your combined efforts, collaboration and commitment to Distance Learning. It has been a challenging time for everyone. We have all worked together to keep our focus and priority on your child's/teen's learning and emotional well-being during this time.

To honor our Class of 2020, we have planned a virtual graduation ceremony on Saturday, June 6th at 10 am. I invite you to join this celebration by visiting Beloit Memorial High School's or Beloit Learning Academy's website homepage on June 6th at 10 am. We are so proud of our 2020 graduates, and we wish them all the best as they pursue their future dreams.

As we move toward our final week of Distance Learning, I wanted to share with you many important updates:

Distance Learning: Last Day of School:

Thursday, June 4th for seniors Friday, June 5th for 4K through 11th grade

Year-end Pick Up of Student Belongings:

4K Through 11th Grade Students:

Families will be able to pick-up student belongings from June 15th - 19th.

Families will receive detailed instructions from their child's/teen's school regarding the distribution of student personal belongings including medications, if applicable. To minimize health risks, no students or family members will be allowed inside buildings at this time.

Graduating Seniors:

All graduating seniors will have an alternate timeframe to pick up their belongings. Communication and details will be forthcoming from Beloit Memorial High School and Beloit Learning Academy.

Returning Textbooks and Musical Instruments:

4K Through 11th Grade Students:

Families will be responsible for returning textbooks and musical instruments to their school when they pick up their personal belongings on their designated dates.

Graduating Seniors:

Seniors will return all textbooks, musical instruments, and technology devices to Beloit Memorial Highschool or Beloit Learning Academy during times designated by their school administrator.

Textbooks and instruments should be placed in bags and clearly labeled with the student's name.







Student devices (iPad/Chromebook):

K Through 11th Grade Students:

Devices will **not** be collected at this time. Students will continue to utilize district assigned devices to access summer school and other educational activities available on the Distance Learning Websites.

Students/families are responsible to return devices when we return to face-to-face instruction. Third and Eighth-grade students will take their district assigned device to their new building in the fall (Intermediate/High School). More detailed information regarding returning devices will be shared prior to the start of 2020/2021 school year.

Graduating Seniors:

Seniors will return devices to Beloit Memorial High School or Beloit Learning Academy during times designated by their school administrators.

Report Cards:

You will receive your child's/teen's Term 4 report card in the mail. Grades from Term 4 will be recorded as follow:

4K - 8th-grade: Progress/Limited Progress

9th - 12th-grade: Pass/Fail

4K-8th-grade students who partially participated or were unable to participate in Distance Learning opportunities due to the COVID 19 worldwide pandemic and mandatory school closures will receive "Limited Progress" on goals addressed through Distance Learning.

9th-12th-grade students who were unable to successfully pass course work due to COVID-19, or other factors, will have opportunities to participate in credit recovery during summer school and into the fall semester. Term 4 grades will not impact students' grade point average (GPA).

Students Moving Out of District:

Students not returning to Beloit schools in the fall of 2020 will need to return technology devices to their buildings. Families should contact their child's/teen's school to arrange a drop off date and time.

Summer Meal Program:

The School District of Beloit will continue to offer breakfast and lunch meals to children under the age of 18 through August 21, 2020. Meals will be served from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm at our elementary schools and at Beloit Memorial High School. Beloit elementary schools providing meal service are Converse, Gaston, Hackett, Merrill, Robinson and Todd.







Summer School:

The School District of Beloit is offering a virtual Summer School Program for all District students. The program is designed to offer a virtual educational opportunity that includes engaging projects, hands-on experiences and interactive participation with teachers. Registration is open and available until **Friday, June 5th**. Please register your child/teen for the **current grade** they are in.

For Elementary and Intermediate Students:

Students will receive daily lessons and/or activities for approximately two hours a day, Monday through Friday. Teachers will be available for office hours to offer support and check-ins with students and families.
